

Put the Bibliography page on its own page at the end of your document

Centre the title and do not italicize.

Single space your text and add a space between each entry

Use italics for titles of larger works like books, journals, and magazines.

Keep margins the same as the rest of your document at 1"

Create hanging indents by indenting 0.5" the second and following lines of each source.
